June is the start of the hurricane season, a critical time for all residents of Margate to bolster their preparedness efforts. The time is now to take timely preventive measures, such as assembling emergency kits, staying informed about evacuation routes, or making arrangements to look after our pets.

Margate residents who are disabled, frail, or have health issues must register in advance with Broward County's Vulnerable Population Registry by calling 3-1-1 or 954-831-4000. This registry enables emergency workers to better respond in a recovery effort. If you are dependent on electricity for your medical needs or have a medical condition that cannot be supported at a general shelter, we recommend you pre-register for the Broward County Special Needs Emergency Sheltering and Transportation Program by calling 954-831-3902.

By proactively planning, Margate residents can navigate the hurricane season with greater confidence and resilience.

## New LED Lighting Coming to Firefighters Park

The City of Margate is investing approximately \$475,000 to install LED lighting in Firefighters Park's tennis, basketball, pickleball, and soccer areas. The sports lighting system will have a remote dimming control, which prevents glare from impacting the area around the fields. It also has performance monitoring with 24/7 customer support to report lighting outages.



## Donation of Trees to Beautify Margate Sports Complex

Thanks to a generous donation from the Fields family, 29 Sylvester Palm Trees have been planted at the Margate Sports Complex. The 20-25-foot tall specimens that enhance the aesthetic appeal of this popular facility are the latest gift made by the Fields family to the City of Margate. Previously, the family donated trees, hedges, and ornamental landscapes to beautify Firefighters Dog Park and Margate Fire Station 18. At a recent Commission meeting, the Margate Community Redevelopment Board and City Commission recognized the family with a plaque.

## Water Main Replacement Project is Underway

The City is replacing all undersized and aged water distribution mains in the area bounded by Margate Boulevard to the north, Atlantic Boulevard to the South, SR 7 to the East, and East River Drive to the West. The project is set to improve the reliability of the City's water distribution system and will replace about 12,000 linear feet of water mains, associated valves, fire hydrants, and service connections.



**Phase 1A** was completed last year and included NW 18th Street and NW 65th Avenue. The City Commission approved the contract award for **Phase 2A** in January. Work is expected to start on the intersection of Margate Boulevard and East River Drive and continue to Park Drive. Project completion is expected by February of next year.

**5** THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT  
STRENGTHENING YOUR HOME

NOAA NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE

1 Keep trees around your home trimmed well before a storm to prevent damage from broken branches

2 Have the proper materials in advance to board up your windows to protect them from flying debris.

3 Bring loose outdoor items such as patio furniture inside. They can blow around and cause damage to homes.

4 Secure all doors on your property. Remember that the garage door is usually the most vulnerable.


5 Move your car inside a garage or to another secure location.



## 5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT UPDATING YOUR INSURANCE



**1** Check your insurance policies well ahead of the storm to see what is covered.



**2** Make sure you have flood insurance. Flooding is the leading cause of damage from tropical systems.



**3** Visit floodsmart.gov to learn about your flood risk and flood insurance options for your area.



**4** Prepare your home and vehicles according to your specific insurance policies to ensure damages are covered.



**5** Know where your insurance documents and contact information are located. Take them with you if you evacuate.

## 5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT HURRICANE HAZARD RISKS



**1** Storm surge is water pushed onshore by the tropical system. It causes the most damage of any of the hurricane hazards.



**2** Wind from a hurricane can top 200 mph and cause massive damage to buildings in its path.



**3** Inland flooding caused by heavy rain damages homes and can wash out roadways well away from the coast.



**4** Tornadoes are common as a hurricane moves ashore. They are not typically long-lived, but they can cause plenty of damage.



**5** Rip currents and rough seas are common both before and after a hurricane, making swimming or surfing very dangerous.
